 - Acting as course organiser for the core MSc core course *International Relations Theory* (on the MSc programme: International and European Politics)

- Acting as course organiser for the MSc option International Security and the Honours option International Security.
- Giving a set of lectures on international relations theory and the United Nations on the second year politics core course: *International co-operation in Europe and Beyond*. (During the period January-March 2004 I also acted as the temporary course convenor).
- During the academic years 2003-2004 and 2004-2005 I acted as the course organiser for the honours course *the Common Foreign and Security Policy of the EU* (topics taught included the emergence of the Rapid Reaction Force (RRF), the EU and international terrorism, the EU and international crisis management)
